









Known losses series 10: 20.11.42-21.01.44

November 1942

Series 11 – introduction of the two seaters made reasonable to use the same design of the wooden rear part of the fuselage and to make it longer. Aluminum tube after armor part and before the wooden posterior part of the fuselage abolished and the longer wooden fuselage reached the armored part directly. It demanded additional strengthening of the joint. Zavod 30 used modified second design variant of the joint of the zavod 18 with upper metal curved overlays and the front part of wooden tail thickened with additional veneer.
